Definitions of adjectives

1. STALE

- **1.** Having lost freshness, effervescence, or palatability: stale bread; stale air.
- 2. Lacking originality or spontaneity: a stale joke.

1. RANCID

- **1.** Having the disagreeable odor or taste of decomposing oils or fats; rank.
- 2. Repugnant; nasty: rancid remarks.

1. ANCIENT

- **1.** A very old person.
- 2. A person who lived in times long past.

3. Ancients

- a. The peoples of the classical nations of antiquity.
- b. The ancient Greek and Roman authors.

1. MUSTY

- 1. smelling or tasting old, stale, or mouldy
- 2. old-fashioned, dull, or hackneyed musty ideas, musty old books

2. ERECTED

- **1.** Being in a vertical, upright position: an erect posture.
- **2.** Being in a stiff, rigid physiological condition.

2. STACKED

- 1. arranged in a stack
- STACK: An orderly pile, especially one arranged in layers.

2. ORDERED

1. A condition of logical or comprehensible arrangement among the separate elements of a group.

2. RANKED

- **1.** To place in a row or rows.
- **2.** To give a particular order or position to; classify.

Built-up

1. Made by fastening several layers or sections one on top of the other: a built-up roof.

2. Filled with buildings; developed: a built-up neighborhood.

Cornered

1. To furnish with corners.

Walled

1. Enclosed, surrounded, or fortified with or as if with a wall.

Built in

1. made or incorporated as an integral part: a built-in cupboard

GROSS

a. Exclusive of deductions; total: gross profits.

b. Unmitigated in any way; utter: gross incompetence.

MASS

1. A unified body of matter with no specific shape: a mass of clay.

2. A grouping of individual parts or elements that compose a unified body of unspecified size or quantity: "Take mankind in mass"

3. A large but nonspecific amount or number: a mass of bruises.

BULK

In bulk: In large numbers, amounts, or volume.

Rasher

1. A thin slice of fried or broiled bacon.

Shaving

N. thin paring or slice, esp of wood, that has been shaved from something

Modifier. used when shaving the face, etc. shaving cream

Remnant

1. Something left over; a remainder.

Sprinkling

1. scattering in drops or particles: sprinkled sugar on the cereal.

2. interspersing with something as if by scattering: sprinkling his speech with quotations.

Shedding

1. causing to pour forth: shed tears.

2. To diffuse or radiate; shed light.

Sowing

1. To scatter (seed) over the ground for growing.

2. To strew something around or over (an area); distribute something over.

3. To propagate; disseminate: sow rumors.

Scattering

1. Something scattered, especially a small, irregularly occurring amount or quantity: a scattering of applause.

GRAZED

1. scraped or touched lightly in passing

SCRAPE

1. To remove (an outer layer, for example) from a surface by forceful strokes of an edged or rough instrument: scraped the wallpaper off before painting the wall.

BRUISE

1. To injure the underlying soft tissue or bone of (part of the body) without breaking the skin, as by a blow.

SCRUB

1. To rub hard in order to clean.
