WRITING PRACTICES: hints

The students will work in groups of 3. **No 2, no 4, no 5...**

The teacher will mark 3 different steps in the writing process during the term.

Each text should have around 250 words.

The texts will be related to:

- Descriptive essay
- Narrative essay
- Discursive essay

All texts, and many others, have been studied previously, but they will be reviewed in class if necessary. Anyway, the students are supposed to know how to write this type of texts.

WRITING PRACTICES: sessions

The students should read the selected novel before 20th February 2015.

Each text will be developed in two sessions.

Session 1: Students will plan the correspondent text, proposed by the teachers. The teachers, at random, will revise plans in a number of groups. After planning, students will begin drafting their text.

Session 2: Students will continue drafting and writing the final version. Teachers, at random, will revise drafts. At the end of the session, the teacher will collect some of the final versions at random.

The mark for assistance will be obtained attending to these sessions (6 for the whole term). These sessions will be announced in advance.

Only texts written during class sessions will be marked.

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ORAL PRACTICES: hints

At least twice during the term, the conversation assistant will collect oral activities for marking. These activities could be of many different types: multiple choice questions after a listening, note taking, gap-filling,...

This can happen at any session, so the conversation assistant will **NOT TELL IN ADVANCE** when these activities are going to take place.
