WRITING PRACTICES (Hints)



The students will work in groups of 5. No 2, no 3, no 4...

The teacher will consider 3 different steps in the writing process during the term, and will mark the final version.

Each text should have around 250 words.

The texts will be related to:

- Formal and informal letters
- Reports and proposals
- Reviews

All texts, and many others, have been studied previously, but they will be reviewed in class if necessary. Anyway, the students are supposed to know how to write this type of texts.



WRITING PRACTICES (Hints)



The students should have read the recommended readings by the following dates:

- 1. 22nd September
- 2. 19th October
- 3. 23th November

Each writing activity will be developed in three parts:

- Pre-writing: Students will plan the correspondent text, proposed by the teachers.
- Drafting: Students will draft their text from previous planning.
- Final version: Students will write the final version of their text.
- The texts will be written as homework (not in class). Please double-copy the texts as the teacher will keep a copy of your work. Each practice activity will be collected as stated in schedule.

Groups will meet the teacher during specific zoom sessions to check their texts (voluntary task)



READING AND LISTENING PRACTICES (Hints)



- The teacher will collect 3 reading and listening activities for marking. These activities could be of many different types:
 - ☐ Reading: multiple choice questions after a reading, text with paragraphs missing, cross-text multiple matching, ...
 - ☐ Listening: completing notes, multiple choice,...
- All reading practices will be done on Thursdays, as indicated in the planning:
 - ✓ Practice 1: 29th September
 - ✓ Practice 2: 27th October
 - ✓ Practice 3: 24th November



SPEAKING PRACTICES (Hints)



- The teacher/LECTOR will mark 2 speaking activities. These activities could be of many different types: multiple choice questions after a listening, note taking, gap-filling, a recording, class active participation, ...
- The task will be programmed and scheduled by the LECTOR
- The practical sessions with the LECTOR will begin in October.


